Utopia yoo'tōpēə/ *noun*

An imagined place or state of things in which everything is perfect. The word was first used in the book *Utopia* (1516) by Sir Thomas More.

Synonyms: paradise, heaven (on earth), Eden

Dystopia dĭs-tō'pē-ə *noun*

1 An imaginary place or state in which the condition of life is extremely bad, as from deprivation, oppression, or terror.

2 An imaginary society in which social or technological trends have culminated in a greatly diminished quality of life or degradation of values.
