

Works Cited Instructions

- 1) The works cited page must include all works quoted and paraphrased in your essay
- 2) Center the title, Works Cited, at the top of the page
- 3) Alphabetize entries by the first item on each bibliography card (either the author's last name or the first word in the title)
- 4) Double-space the entire document (and be sure that you have removed after-paragraph spacing)
- 5) After you have typed all entries, select all items on the page
- 6) Under paragraph settings, select "Hanging" from the "Special" drop-down menu and set spacing at 0.5"
